Approve Minutes of previous Meetings

Motion: Approve Minutes of Feb 10. Jonah moves and Heiko seconds. No objection to unanimous approval.

Discussions

Welcome to Eclipse Working Group

Thomas introduced Christoph, who is participating as a guest from the iJUG, despite not being fully part of the working group yet. Christoph expressed his interest in contributing to the Eclipse IDE's progress and mentioned his involvement with a Java user group. Mark welcomed Christoph to the group and expressed appreciation for his interest and commitment.

Eclipse Foundation's Embedded World Preparation

Thomas provided updates on the Eclipse Foundation's activities, focusing on the preparation for the Embedded World Conference and the need to engage with key organizations who use the Eclipse platform. He highlighted the importance of updating presentations and addressing the decreasing support for the Dev Funding Effort. Thomas also mentioned the need to identify new sponsors and explore funding models, including sovereign tech funds, with a sense of urgency due to upcoming deadlines in March.

CRA Impact on Open Source

The team discussed the impact of CRA requirements on open source providers and consumers, with Thomas reporting that a representative from the Eclipse Open Regulation Compliance Working Group will present concrete outcomes at an upcoming meeting. The discussion highlighted the need for a clear explanation of how CRA impacts different stakeholders, with Heiko noting that threat analysis requirements for open source components would be an important consideration for product providers.

Eclipse Risk Dashboard Review

The meeting focused on discussing a new risk management dashboard created by Thomas using GitLab. The dashboard identifies seven critical risks facing the Eclipse IDE project, including funding issues and member involvement challenges. Mark and others provided feedback, noting that while the risks are accurately represented, there should be more acknowledgment of ongoing mitigating actions. The group agreed that while the dashboard is currently private for steering committee members, it may need to be made more public in the future. They also discussed a potential BOF session focused on AI-related changes and the Eclipse Agents project.

- Thomas: Share the risk management dashboard with the Eclipse Foundation leadership team

- Thomas: Share the risk management dashboard questionnaire with working group members for completion
- Thomas: Coordinate with documentation regarding CRA impact
- Interested organizations: Consider and discuss potential investment of resources into the Eclipse Agents project, including possible collaboration at OCX
- Thomas: Update the risk management dashboard to more explicitly show ongoing mitigations and evolution of risks (e.g., add green ticks or special colors for ongoing actions)
